In six years, we have transformed the organization and when our fiscal year closed on March 31, 2023, we recorded our best year so far. It's not just about the numbers, although they are important, it is about the impact on lives across the state. This past year our staff and volunteers provided services for more than **57,000** individuals across the state and trained **1,200** vision screeners. We presented to thousands of people about eye health and safety. PBT continues to assess the data, analyze trends, and work with our partners to implement more effective interventions. The demand for all our services continues to exceed capacity at a rapid rate. The healthcare landscape in our state is challenging and improved access requires innovative and collaborative solutions.

As we prepare and shape our work for the future, we are ready for not one but *two* solar eclipses within the next year! PBT will continue to tackle the hard issues, stay centered on how to best serve our communities, elevate the conversation about how important eye health is to overall health, and collaborate with community partners across the state and nation to build a better system for improved access to care for our clients. 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

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
Baker Ripley Aldine

Since 2021, Prevent Blindness Texas has trained and certified more than 180 Navarro nursing students who are contributing to the health and well-being of more than 7,500 middle school students in Fort Worth ISD.
