Who We Are

For almost 70 years, Prevent Blindness Texas has provided critical vision care to Texas's most vulnerable citizens by providing early detection screening services, eye health education, navigation services, and financial resources for exams, glasses, and other treatment needs. We focus on populations most at risk for possible vision problems. Last year, Prevent Blindness Texas served over 61,000 individuals, and educated more than 129,000 people.

Fostering an environment of courage, leadership, and respect.







Partner Highlights



Good Samaritan Center

Since 2017, the Good Samaritan Center (GSC) has partnered with Prevent Blindness Texas (PBT) to provide preventive vision screenings, eye health education, navigation services, and financial assistance for comprehensive eye exams and prescription eyeglasses, serving primarily high-risk adults across Gillespie County and surrounding counties in the Texas Hill Country. This collaboration has strengthened our shared commitment to equitable access to vision care by addressing barriers related to cost, transportation, and awareness. Together, we have expanded access to timely care and encouraged lifelong eye health practices that help individuals preserve their vision and prevent avoidable vision loss. Through this partnership, GSC and PBT continue to highlight the vital connection between vision health, overall well-being, and fostering resilient, thriving communities.

Houston Delta Gamma Foundation

The Houston Delta Gamma Foundation plays a vital role in bridging gaps in funding and services for the blind and visually impaired in the Greater Houston Area. The partnership between Prevent Blindness Texas (PBT) and the Houston Delta Gamma Foundation (HDGF) reflects a shared commitment to doing the most good by preserving sight and improving quality of life for individuals, particularly for children at risk of vision problems. Partner Highlights



Lamar University, JoAnne Gay Dishman School of Nursing

In 2024, Prevent Blindness Texas partnered for the first time with the Lamar University, JoAnne Gay Dishman School of Nursing to provide children's vision screening training and certification to over 80 nursing students. This hands-on partnership allows students to support local schools by assisting school nurses with timely vision screenings, while preparing them to deliver high-quality healthcare to individuals, families, and communities. Together, we are working to protect and promote the eye health of children and families within their communities.

The Najim Charitable Foundation

Through our partnership with The Najim Charitable Foundation, Prevent Blindness Texas (PBT) has expanded access to essential vision care for underserved children in the Greater San Antonio Area. This collaboration enables PBT to provide certified vision screenings, eye health education, navigation services for children identified with potential vision problems, and financial resources for those who might otherwise go without care. This partnership reflects a shared commitment to the early detection and prevention of vision issues, helping children thrive academically and socially. We are deeply grateful for the Najim Charitable Foundation's ongoing investment in the health and well-being of our youngest community members.

"My experiences with PBT have been deeply formative, shaping both my career aspirations and my perspective as a future physician. They have shown me the power of community partnerships and the importance of truly listening to patients' needs. I have learned that when we meet people where they are, whether in shelters, schools, or free clinics, PBT does more than improve vision; this organization expand opportunity and possibility to underserved individuals."

What have you gained from volunteering with PBT?

"Volunteering with PBT has been an immensely meaningful experience. One moment that continues to resonate with me occurred at a UGM clinic serving families experiencing homelessness. A young boy, struggling academically, was referred for suspected vision issues. Evaluation revealed an uncorrected refractive error, and we were able to provide him with glasses. At a subsequent clinic, his mother shared that his grades had improved significantly and that he was finally able to keep up in class. Experiences like this remind me that our work is not only about restoring sight, it is about restoring opportunities, confidence, and dignity. That impact continues to motivate me."

Why is it important to you to volunteer with PBT?

"Vision is foundational to education, employment, and daily independence. Without access to appropriate care, individuals encounter profound barriers in nearly every aspect of life. My work collaborating with PBT is guided by the belief that no one should be disadvantaged simply because they cannot afford an eye exam or corrective lenses. Promoting equity in vision care represents a broader commitment to fairness, access, and the opportunity for every individual to thrive."

Why should others volunteer with PBT?

"Volunteering with PBT offers the chance to make an immediate and tangible difference. Something as simple as enabling someone to read, succeed in school, or navigate their surroundings safely can change the trajectory of their life. Beyond the impact on patients, volunteers become part of a dedicated community united by the mission to ensure that vision care is accessible for all."
